- 1. In the glories of the Philadelphian period, the mid to late 1800's also gave rise to four key false philosophies. #WordStrong
- 2. These philosophies are vital to understanding how Laodicea became Laodicea. They changed the world/Christianity. #WordStrong
- 3. The four philosophies are: 1) Modernism/Higher Criticism; 2) Darwinism; 3) Freudianism; 4) Humanism. #WordStrong
- 4. The devil was seeking to remove God from society through Modernism and Higher Criticism. #WordStrong
- 5. The devil provided a quote-unquote "scientific" explanation about the origin of man through Darwinism. (1Tim. 6:20) #WordStrong
- 6. The devil provided man a way to remove his guilt and deal with his problems other than through the Bible through Freudianism. #WordStrong
- 7. Humanism was simply the natural result of these three major philosophies replacing God's wisdom in man's mind and in society. #WordStrong
- 8. The final piece to the Philadelphian puzzle was the devil breaking man's confidence in the authority of the Word of God. #WordStrong
- 9. In the Thyatira/Sardis periods, the Bible was PHYSICALLY taken out of the hands of the common man by Catholics thru PERSECUTION. #WordStrong
- 10. In the Laodicean period, the Bible was "PRACTICALLY" taken out of the hands of the common man by the Jesuits thru EDUCATION. #WordStrong
